The Palestinian tourism sector has the potential to be a main contributor to the GDP in Palestine.

PCBS began publishing reports about hotel activities from the Third quarter of 1996. PCBS is pleased to present the third issue of the fifteenth volume on "Hotel Activities in the Palestinian Territory" which covers statistics on the hotel industry for the third quarter of 2009.

PCBS has implemented several surveys to cover the supply and demand sides of tourism, including the Hotel Activity survey in the Palestinian Territory, a continuous and permanent survey since 1996, a survey of Tourism Activities 2002 and 2007, and the Domestic Tourism survey for the years 1998, 2005, 2006, and 2008. The survey of Outbound Tourism in 2004 and a survey of Inbound Tourism in 2005 were also implemented. This covers an important aspect of tourist demand and is an additional step to further implement surveys for tourism-related statistics, to build the necessary database to establish the Tourism Satellite Accounts (TSA) in the Palestinian Territory

This report addresses the main indicators of the hotel industry. These indicators include the number of operating hotels, number of rooms and beds, public facilities in the surveyed hotels, number of employed persons in hotels, number of guest nights in the reference period, number of guests by nationality and rates of bed and room occupancy.

We hope that the Hotel Activities survey in the Palestinian Territory is a step towards supporting the tourism sector which strengthens the national economy.

Executive Summary

The main findings of the Hotel Activities Survey during the Third quarter of 2009 are as follows:

- There are 89 operating hotels in September 2009, offering 4,666 rooms with 10,238 total available beds.
- The average occupancy of rooms was 1,826; occupancy increased by 42.8% compared with the same quarter of the year 2008, and it increased by 34.6% compared with the previous quarter.
- The average number of workers in the hotels was 1,523 of which 227 were females.
- During the Third quarter 2009, the total number of guests to the Palestinian Territory hotels reached 135,939; the number reflect an increase of 42.0% compared with the same quarter of the year 2008.
- Most of the guests were in Jerusalem, representing 50.6% of the total guests, whereas 21.4% of the guests were in the Middle of the West Bank, 25.8% were in the South of the West Bank.
- The total number of guest nights was 310,643. The number reflect an increase of 29.0% during the third quarter 2009 compared with the previous quarter, while it increased by 30.3% compared with the corresponding quarter in the year 2008.
- The average length of stay in the Palestinian hotels was 2.3 nights per guest during the third quarter 2009.

Chapter One

Introduction

Tourism is considered a cornerstone of the Palestinian economy and there are many attractive touristic resorts for people of different interests. PCBS began to collect statistical data on tourism and monitor hotel activities through a continuous and comprehensive survey since 1996, carried out on a monthly basis. This activity follows the World Tourism Organization and European Union recommendations. It aimed to produce a comprehensive database and time series of basic indicators on the hotel industry hoping to enable the development and promotion of the tourism industry in Palestine.

A quarterly report is regularly produced and a collective comprehensive report is produced annually. This publication presents data on hotels for the third quarter 2009; and results indicate an improvement in most indicators compared to the previous seven years.

Chapter Two

Concepts and Definitions

This section presents the main concepts and definitions used to derive the main indicators of tourism statistics. These concepts and definitions are based on international recommendations in the field of tourism statistics, and are applied to the rest of the common subjects in the PCBS. The main concepts and definitions mentioned in this report were as follows:

Hotel:

It is defined as an accommodation establishment providing overnight lodging for the visitors in a room or unit. It should hold a number of persons exceeding that of an average single family. The establishment must be under one management, and provides various facilities and services to visitors.

Operating Hotels:

It is defined as the hotels that included in the sample frame and results, exluding the non operating hotels that are carrying out repairs or maintenance, and the hotels which didn't respond to the survey.

Number of Rooms:

It refers to the furnished rooms for the use of guests. Such rooms might be single, double, triple, or quadruple. Rooms involving more than four beds were classified under (others) in the questionnaire. As for the suite, it is usually comprised of one bedroom or more, a living room and private toilet facilities.

Available Beds and Rooms:

It refers to beds and rooms which are ready for use during the reference period. Rooms closed for maintenance or repairs are excluded.

Guests:

It refers to visitors staying in the hotels and using their facilities. Records of new guests are based on the number of visits regardless whether it's the same person or different.

Number of Guest Nights (Bed Occupancy):

Number of beds booked for hotel guests. Such beds are considered as occupied whether they were actually used or not. It is measured by guest night unit.

Room Occupancy:

Number of booked and paid rooms. Such rooms are considered occupied whether they were actually used or not.

Average (rooms, beds) Occupancy:

It is defined as the total number of occupied (rooms, beds) divided by the number of days.

Percentage of (rooms, beds) Occupancy:

It is defined as the average of (rooms, beds) occupancy divided by available (rooms, beds) multiplied by one hundred.

Average Length of Stay:

Represents the total of guest nights by nationality divided by number of guests of the same nationality.

North of West Bank Region:

Jenin, Tulkarm, Nablus, Qalqiliya, Salfit and Tubas governorates.

Middle of West Bank Region:

Ramallah and Al-Bireh, Jericho and Al-Aghwar governorates.

Jerusalem Region:

Jerusalem governorate.

South of West Bank Region:

Bethlehem and Hebron governorates.

Gaza Strip:

North Gaza, Gaza, Deir Al-Balah, Khan Yunis and Rafah governorates.

Chapter Three

Main Findings

The total number of hotels in the Palestinian Territory was 118 hotels, including those temporarily closed. There were 89 operating hotels in September 2009, offering 4,666 rooms with 10,238 total available beds.

3.1 Hotel Capacity during September, 2009

The operating hotels within the Palestinian Territory in the third Quarter 2009 were distributed as follows:

- North of West Bank: 7 hotels including 166 rooms comprising 364 beds.
- Middle of West Bank: 22 hotels including 1,014 rooms comprising 2,216 beds.
- Jerusalem Region: 30 hotels including 1,503 rooms comprising 3,343 beds.
- South of West Bank: 22 hotels including 1,662 rooms comprising 3,779 beds.
- Gaza Strip: 8 hotels including 321 rooms comprising 536 beds.

3.2 Room Occupancy during the Third Quarter, 2009

The average occupancy of rooms in the Palestinian hotels was 1,825.6 representing 39.7% from the available rooms.

3.3 Hotel Workers during the Third Quarter, 2009

The average number of workers in the hotels was 1,523 of which 1,296 were males and 227 were females. The number of workers in hotel administration was 268, of which 211 were males and 57 were females. There were 1,255 workers in hotels services, of which 1,085 were males and 170 were females.

3.4 Guests and Nights Occupancy during the Third Quarter, 2009

The total number of guests in the Palestinian hotels was 135,939 persons, of which 14.7% were Palestinian guests, and 34.4% were from the European Union countries. The number of guests showed an increase by 42.0%, compared with the same quarter of the year 2008.




Figure (1): Percentage Distribution of Guests by Nationality During the Third Quarter, 2009

The total number of guest nights in Palestinian hotels during the third quarter 2009 was 310,643 of which: 15.6% of these nights were occupied by Palestinian guests, 36.7% by guests from European Union countries, and 10.8% by guests from the United States and Canada.

The guest nights distributed according to the region are as follows: guests spent 48.5% of total nights in Jerusalem hotels, and 19.1%, 30.7%, and 1.6% in Middle, South, and North of the West Bank, respectively, and 0.1% of nights in Gaza Strip hotels.

The table below presents the main results of the third quarter of 2009, and explains the changes that occurred in the main indicators for Palestinian hotels activities, compared with the previous quarter, and with the results of the third quarter of 2008.
